CDR's Mission

The [Commission on Dietetic Registration](#) administers valid, reliable, and rigorous credentialing processes to meet the professional needs of credentialed practitioners and their employers and to protect the public.

The Commissioners oversee the [Strategic Plan](#), governance and policy that guide credentialed practitioners through program of work activities of its committees, panels, task forces and advisory groups.

CDR is seeking a Newly Credentialed Practitioner to join its Commission Board.

Qualifications

- A newly credential registered dietitian is defined as a registered dietitian who was initially registered by CDR between **June 1, 2024 and August 1, 2025**.
- Nominees should possess demonstrated leadership qualities and knowledge of credentialing requirements for the nutrition and dietetics profession.
- Nominees should be strategically oriented.

Recommended Skill Sets

- Communicates clearly and effectively.
- Encourages and promotes diversity.
- Built a network of relationships and resources.
- Demonstrates organizational and management skills.

Functions

- Provide the newly credentialed practitioner perspective to CDR on certification and recertification issues.
- Commitment to team decision-making and accomplishment of CDR's strategic plan.
- Maintain objectivity in advising, counseling, and working with the Commission Board.
- Skills in consensus building.
- Act and advocate in all appropriate ways before the public, profession and educational entities, and all levels of government to encourage and achieve the highest standards in the practice of dietetics.
- Establish and evaluate standards, policies and procedures for the certification program including registration eligibility, examination development and recertification.
- Establish fees and provide responsible fiscal planning and control for the administration of the certification programs.
- Establish policies and guidelines for the administration of appeals process.
- Assist CDR Chair and Chair-Elect in the appointment of committees, panels, advisory group and task forces to support the Commission Board in its program of work.

- In-Person Meetings: One (1) 7-hour meeting at FNCE October, and
One (1) 2-day meeting in May
